TREE PLANTING ON TIDAL WOOD

500 COASTAL TREES PLANTED ON TIDAL WOOD - AND GROWING!

In 2022, we pledged our support to the Aird na Cille rewilding initiative in Scotland's Outer Hebrides, planting more than 500 trees.

The rewilding project is focused on a 25-acre peninsula of glacial-carved rock, on the southern coast of the Isle of Scalpay off Harris. Before this incredible rewilding project began, the area had become almost devoid of trees.

Now, trees planted in early 2022 are already reaching heights of 10–12 feet and a surge of wildlife has returned to this revitalised wilderness.

We're committed to continuing our support to Aird na Cille, including the planting of more trees in 2023 and beyond.
